WELCOME TO THE CARBONDALE WILD WEST RODEO

WELCOME BACK TO THE 2023 CARBONDALE WILD WEST RODEO SERIES! The Rodeo is now in its 18th season and promises to be as fun and exciting as ever! Lots of great rodeo action, good food and good friends are at the rodeo every Thursday night all summer. Last season we had some of our biggest crowds ever and a few rainy, muddy nights as well, just because a rodeo in the mud is so much fun!

At the conclusion of the 2023 season, we will be offering a \$2,000 scholarship to a deserving contestant or volunteer for use in a college or trade school. Watch for application details on the CWWRA web site. We will also be presenting a new saddle at the end of the season to the top money winner in two events or more (All-Around Winner).

Lots of changes this year, mostly driven by the large crowds we have been getting the last few years. Watch for details or check the web site. These include the following: Due to rising costs, we are forced to increase ticket price (first time since 2011) from \$10 to \$15 per person. We also will be charging an on-site parking fee of \$10 per vehicle. We hope this will help encourage folks to RIDE THE FREE SHUTTLE BUSES FROM TOWN this year for the first time ever. There will be NO PARKING on County Road 100 this year and LIMITED PARKING in the neighborhood nearby (by order of Sheriff Dept). The parking around the arena will increase to \$50 and may include on-line signups (rather than a waiting line) so watch for details. Lastly, "bring your own alcohol" will no longer be allowed and alcohol will be sold on site (by order of Sheriff Dept and Town Police Dept), in order to be better controlled. We realize change can be difficult, but sometimes there is no choice and we believe everyone will adapt and enjoy the Rodeo!

As always, there are a lot of people to thank! First a big thank you to our sponsors. Without the sponsorship of numerous businesses and individuals, we would not have the financial ability to do this. New sponsors are always welcome, so if you are looking for a great way to advertise and support the rodeo at the same time, please talk to us. We urge all the spectators and contestants alike, to support these sponsors who support the CWWRA! We would also like to thank the contestants young and old, who show up week after week and compete, putting on a great show for everyone to enjoy. Next, we would like to thank you the spectators who support the rodeo and we hope that you enjoy the rodeo series we all have worked hard to produce. Last and certainly not least, we would like to thank the volunteers who show up every week and help make this rodeo happen. Thank you for coming out to attend the Carbondale Wild West Rodeo tonight and supporting our efforts to stage a "Small Town Rodeo" that offers "Big Time Fun". So that you have a safe and enjoyable evening, the Town of Carbondale and the volunteers of the Carbondale Wild West Rodeo Association would like you to observe the following:

- 1. For your safety, NO PARKING ALONG COUNTY ROAD 100. Please park in close proximity to the car/truck next to you. Listen to parking volunteers for directions on where to park. Overflow parking, if you cannot find a space, is out the back gate on Willow Lane. Please do not block driveways on Willow Lane and enter through the back gate from Willow Lane.
- 2. Keep the lane around the arena clear of vehicles for ingress and egress and flow of emergency vehicles.
- 3. Please leave your dogs at home.
- 4. Please keep off and don't stand or sit on the Arena Perimeter Fence. It blocks the view of spectators and could prove hazardous when livestock crowd the fence.
- 5. Parents, it's recommended that you supervise and keep your small children with you at all times to prevent possible accidents with horse riders or vehicles on the perimeter lane around the arena. Keep kids away and out of the back practice warm up area where the horses are.
- 6. Food coolers, BBQ grills, and tailgate picnics are allowed. No outside alcohol can be brought in. A food and beverage caterer is located under the white tent on the east side of the main grandstand.
- 7. Please pick up your trash and dispose of it properly or take it with you. Please recycle.
- 8. Port-a-potties are located on the west side of the main grandstand rodeo registration area and next to the white & green barn on the northeast side of the Rodeo Grounds.
- 9. All rodeo contestants, including kids participating in Mutton Bustin' and/or the Calf Scramble must sign up and register for the event and sign a waiver at the registration booth west of the main grandstand. Sign up starts at 5:00 p.m.
- 10. Please use caution and drive safely when exiting as there are lots of pedestrians and heavy traffic.
- 11. The Wild West Rodeo Series is held every Thursday night, rain or shine, with the rodeo grand entry beginning at 7:30 p.m., through August 17 (Wild West Rodeo Finals).
- 12. If interested in assisting us as a volunteer committee member of the Carbondale Wild West Rodeo Association, please contact our Volunteer Coordinator, Melanie Cardiff at 970-379-0809.
- 13. Free shuttle buses from Carbondale available.



Most of the menu items are made from scratch and sourced locally to support our farmers and ranchers.


JC Food Truck will also provide traditional Mexican food.






OPEN BARREL RACING



Open barrel racing is for those ages 13 years and up. The goal of barrel racing is to do a cloverleaf pattern around three barrels in the fastest time. The horses pivot on their haunches at a very high speed and execute each turn with only a few inches to spare. Normally, Quarter Horses are used in barrel racing. If a barrel is knocked over, there is a five-second penalty.

TEAM ROPING

Team roping demands close cooperation between two cowboys ("header" and "heeler") and their horses. The steer is given a head start as the header waits behind a rope barrier. If the header breaks the barrier, there is a 10-second penalty against the team. The heeler follows after the header has begun his pursuit. The header is the first one to rope and must catch the steer either around the horns, around the neck, or around one horn and the head.

As soon as the header secures the loop, he "dallies" the rope around the saddle horn and rides to the left, turning the steer away from a right-handed heeler.

As the header rides away, the heeler tries to rope the steer's hind feet. There is a five-second penalty if the heeler catches only one foot.

The two riders back their agile horses to take the slack out of their ropes. The clock stops when all the slack has been taken up and the ropers are facing one another.

BULL RIDING

In what the cowboy hopes will be an eight-second ride, he holds a flat-braided rope in his glove hand. As he settles onto his bull's back in the chute, he pulls the tail of the rope through a loop, then wraps the rope around his riding hand, at times weaving the rope through his fingers to secure his grip.

Each bull has a different style of bucking. Some bulls spin, while others continuously circle in one area. Some bulls add a jump or a kick to their spin and others move sideways in mid-air.



As the cowboy waves his free hand to counter the bull's gyration and maintain his balance, he must avoid touching the bull with the free hand or he is disqualified. The cowboy's control and the bull's bucking efforts each account for half of the score.




LADIES BREAKAWAY ROPING


Ladies Breakaway Roping has been a favorite since added in 2014. Ladies Breakaway roping is for ladies 17 and up. Limited to 15 ropers per rodeo. An electronic eye barrier is used to ensure calves are allowed a head start. The roper must throw the rope in a loop around the calf's neck. Once the rope is around the calf's neck, the roper signals the horse to stop suddenly. The rope is tied to the saddle horn with a string. When the calf reaches the end of the rope, the rope is pulled tight and the string breaks. The breaking of the string marks the end of the run. The fastest run wins. A 25 second time limit applies.


This event is for the little cowpokes, **at least 3 years old and under 50 pounds.** A cowgirl or cowboy climbs aboard a sheep and is turned loose in the arena. The "Mutton Buster" who rides the longest, wins!! Helmets and protective vests are required and provided. To register, mutton busters must sign up at the Secretary's Shed by 5:00 p.m. During this registration process, the first 10 will be allowed to ride and we will take 3 alternates. Also, mutton busters must take one week off after each attempt. This will allow many more children to be involved.





DALLY RIBBON ROPING

The Dally Ribbon Roping event consists of a team of either a man and woman or an adult and a youth under the age of sixteen. One member of the team ropes the calf which has a ribbon tied to it's tail and attempts to hold it in place while the other team member runs to the calf, grabs the ribbon from it's tail and runs back across the start line for a time. The fastest time, wins!



RANCH BRONC RIDING

It is a 'ride as ride can' for 8 seconds. A standard, working ranch saddle is used and the horse is saddled as it would be for everyday ranch work. The broncs (horses) wear a bronc halter with one rein for the rider to hold onto. This is called a "bronc rein" or a "hack rein." Ranch Bronc Riders are allowed to hold onto the saddle horn, cantle, or a night latch (a rope or strap tied through the gullet of the saddle) with their free hand (the one not holding the hack rein). Riders are not disgualified by a loss of a stirrup and there is no "mark out" rule - the Ranch Bronc Rider does not have to have the rowels of his/her spurs touching the break of the broncs' shoulders on the first jump out of the chute until the broncs' feet hit the ground. This year Ranch Bronc Riding will be featured 6 times including the finals with a buckle going to the season champion.






JUNIOR BREAKAWAY ROPING

Junior Breakaway Roping is open to girls ages 8-16 and boys ages 8-14. Limited to 10 contestants. Watch young cowboys and cowgirls perfecting their roping skills. Junior Breakaway Roping is a great training ground to move up to Dally Ribbon Roping, Ladies Breakaway and Team Roping. Features one mounted cowgirl or cowboy in pursuit of a calf. An electronic eye barrier is used to ensure calves are allowed a head start. The roper must throw the rope in a loop around the calf's neck. Once the rope is around the calf's neck, the roper signals the horse to stop suddenly. The rope is tied to the saddle horn with a string. When the calf reaches the end of the rope, the rope is pulled tight and the string breaks. The breaking of the string marks the end of the run. The fastest run wins. A 25 second time limit applies.


STEER RIDING




CALF SCRAMBLE
